The Original Living Christmas Tree Company (TOLCTC) delivers full size potted trees then picks them up after New Years and the trees get planted in watersheds to grow old.

Here's how it works: Folks order their Christmas tree through their website, livingchristmastrees.org. TOLCTC delivers potted full-size evergreen trees to residences and businesses. TOLCTC picks up the trees after New Years. Trees get planted by planting groups such as parks departments and schools.

The Christmas trees top out at \$100. The trees are naturally shaped, not sheered into cones. They are easy to care for and each tree has a deposit check to make sure planters get quality trees.

Living Christmas trees are 6' or 7.5' size. Clients can choose from ten kinds of cedar, juniper, pine, spruce and fir. The main tree offered is the Douglas fir, the State Tree of Oregon and the most popular tree worldwide. Over 400 trees are arranged to be planted so that many can be Christmas trees.
